

***Section 4(1) (b)(xii) of Right To Information Act,2005***

***The manner of execution of subsidy programmes, including the amounts allocated and the details of beneficiaries of such programmes***

**There is only one Scheme under the subsidy programme known as Grant of financial Assistance to Educated Un-employed Youth.**

This annual plan scheme provides the grant of 25% subsidy to Educated Un-employed Youth of the State to run Transport services as a mass of self employment.

The details of the scheme are as follows :-

- (i) The applicants should have passed the H.S.L.C. examination and above.
- (ii) The applicants should not be less than 21 years and not more than 35 years as on 1<sup>st</sup> January (of the year of application).
- (iii) The applicants should possess a valid driving license to drive transport vehicles.
- (iv) The applicants should be physically and mentally fit and should produced a medical certificate from the competent authority.
- (v) The applicants should apply to the Commissioner of Transport in the prescribed form as and when the scheme is advertised, enclosing therein all the relevant documents such as age certificate, educational qualification certificate, driving license etc in support of his candidature.
- (vi) The applicants should be a permanent resident of the State.
- (vii) The selected candidates are given 25% subsidy for the cost of the vehicle which as routed through the M.C.D.P Ltd.

For the year 2004-2005 though there was a budget provision of Rs.5 lakhs, no subsidy was given to any beneficiary during this financial year.
